## Update 25: Puerto Rico - COVID-19 Surge Reported

5/04/2022, 7:23:39 AM

- COVID-19 cases in Puerto Rico are increasing since mid-March 2022
- The spike began after the island lifted all its pandemic restrictions in March 2022
- Puerto Rico reported 26,273 new cases in the last week
- Health experts have warned the US to prepare for the possibility of a summer surge
- **Reported COVID-19 stats for Puerto Rico:**
  1. Confirmed Cases: 545,992
  2. Deaths: 4,215 (0.77%)
  3. Recoveries: 477,975 (87.54%)
  4. Vaccine Doses Administered: 7,163,939
  5. Fully Vaccinated: 2,651,110 (83%)

The economy of Puerto Rico is mainly driven by manufacturing, primarily pharmaceuticals, textiles, petrochemicals, and electronics; followed by the service industry, primarily finance, insurance, real estate, and tourism. Be prepared for possible disruptions to businesses in the region due to the reported incident

## Impact Level Definitions

Impact Level	Definition
Critical	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is critical, and occurrence is imminent</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends considering immediate review and action.
High	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is high and/or disruption is likely to occur within 3 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a heightened state of readiness to take quick action and confirm response plans/protocols.
Moderate	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is moderate and/or likely to occur within 3 to 6 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being prepared to take proactive action if and when situation deteriorates further.
Low	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is low and/or may occur after 6 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve in approved timeframe.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a current risk element associated with it.
