### Update 23: Chile - COVID-19 Infections - Surge in Cases Reported

6/12/2022, 8:56:24 AM

- In the last 24 hours, the country has reported 12,061 COVID-19 cases
- On June 11, 2022, the country reported above 12,000 COVID-19 cases for three consecutive days
- Chile reported 22 COVID-19 deaths on June 11, 2022
- The national positivity against diagnostic tests to detect the disease was 13.93%
- The metropolitan region maintained this indicator higher, with 16.77%
- **Reported COVID-19 stats for Chile:**
  1. Confirmed Cases: 3,808,970
  2. Deaths: 58,076 (1.52%)
  3. Recoveries: 2,124,250 (55.77%)
  4. Vaccine Doses Administered: 57,480,994
  5. Fully Vaccinated: 17,537,338 (91.8%)

## Impact Level Definitions

Impact Level	Definition
Critical	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is critical, and occurrence is imminent</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends considering immediate review and action.
High	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is high and/or disruption is likely to occur within 3 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a heightened state of readiness to take quick action and confirm response plans/protocols.
Moderate	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is moderate and/or likely to occur within 3 to 6 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being prepared to take proactive action if and when situation deteriorates further.
Low	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is low and/or may occur after 6 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve in approved timeframe.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a current risk element associated with it.
