## Update 72: Mexico - COVID-19 Infections - 5,883 New Cases Reported

6/27/2022, 10:04:22 AM

- The Ministry of Health reported 5,883 new COVID-19 cases and 4 deaths on June 26, 2022
- The highest number of COVID-19 cases were recorded in Mexico City with 35,182 followed by 10,562 in the State of Mexico, 6,738 in Nuevo Leon and 4,993 in Quintana Roo
- ~ 719,154 COVID-19 suspected cases were registered with 111,314 active cases
- 50%-70% of bed occupancy was registered in 17 medical units and the same percentage of bed occupancy with ventilators in 4 medical units
- **Reported COVID-19 stats for Mexico:**
  1. Confirmed Cases: 5,962,615
  2. Deaths: 325,580 (5.5%)
  3. Recoveries: 5,150,459 (86.4%)
  4. Vaccine Doses Administered: 209,030,212
  5. Fully Vaccinated Population: 79,947,470 (63.2%)

## Impact Level Definitions

Impact Level	Definition
Critical	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is critical, and occurrence is imminent</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends considering immediate review and action.
High	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is high and/or disruption is likely to occur within 3 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a heightened state of readiness to take quick action and confirm response plans/protocols.
Moderate	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is moderate and/or likely to occur within 3 to 6 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being prepared to take proactive action if and when situation deteriorates further.
Low	<b>Anticipated disruption intensity is low and/or may occur after 6 months</b> - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve in approved timeframe.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a current risk element associated with it.
