Ukraine - Missile Attack Continues - 20 Deaths Reported and Several Injured

- The economy of Ukraine mainly relies on manufacturing and agriculture
 - Russian forces have shelled a civilian evacuation convoy in the country's northeast, killing 20 people
 - The attack was on people who were trying to flee the area to avoid being shelled
 - The convoy was struck in the Kupiansky district
 - Russian forces have retreated from much of the Kharkiv region after a successful Ukrainian counteroffensive in September 2022 but continued to shell the area
 - The bombardment intensified drastically this week, as Russia moved to annex four Ukrainian regions in the east and the south under its full or partial control
 - Additionally, on October 01, 2022, Ukraine's nuclear power provider stated that Russian forces blindfolded and detained the head of the nuclear plant
 - Ukrainian officials stated that their forces had surrounded thousands of Russian forces holding the strategic eastern city of Lyman, which is located in one of the four incorporated areas
 - On October 01, 2022, Russia pulled its troops out of Lyman
 - On September 30, 2022, Zelenskyy formally applied for Ukraine to join NATO, increasing pressure on Western allies to help defend the country
 - Supply Wisdom will continue to monitor the situation and will alert you to any relevant developments

Actions to Consider

- Be prepared for possible disruptions to businesses due to the reported incident
- Continue to closely monitor the situation to update business policies and risk management procedures, as the situation continues to evolve, and sanctions potentially elevate
- Ensure to make an early assessment of the financial, operational, and reputational risks arising from immediate impact of the invasion and sanctions
- Follow the latest government guidance to stay cybersecure and adopt to cyber risk management protocols in case of any cyber-attacks reported
- Establish a risk map or risk summary of operations and locations in conflict zone, including property values and employee counts as critical data
- Travelers are advised to avoid all travel to the affected regions and pay close attention to advisories issued by the local and international authorities
- Evaluate internal controls and processes to assess the risks and determine if increasing geo-political tensions

could impact business operations

- Pay close attention to any change in government policies and business environment amid military tensions
- Remain vigilant for a decline in service levels or quality amid the current economic fallout, and build contingencies to address such scenarios
- Determine strategies to make operations more resilient by diversifying markets and developing alternative sources of supply
- Ensure that Business Continuity plans, and programs are commensurate with the level and types of risk exposures of this location
- Security and travel departments of third parties/captive units should consider issuing internal alerts and travel restrictions as appropriate
- Ensure current Business Continuity Plans of third parties/captive units have a plan for sudden shortage or unavailability of resources in the event several team members are unable to commute to the workplace due to social unrest
- Ensure procedures for protecting infrastructure and evacuating employees to safe locations are in place if required

Impact Level Definitions

Impact Level	Definition
Critical	Anticipated disruption intensity is critical, and occurrence is imminent - Supply Wisdom recommends considering immediate review and action.
High	Anticipated disruption intensity is high and/or disruption is likely to occur within 3 months - Supply Wisdom recommends being in a heightened state of readiness to take quick action and confirm response plans/protocols.
Moderate	Anticipated disruption intensity is moderate and/or likely to occur within 3 to 6 months - Supply Wisdom recommends reviewing current mitigation steps and being prepared to take proactive action if and when situation deteriorates further.
Low	Anticipated disruption intensity is low and/or may occur after 6 months - Supply Wisdom recommends taking proactive action if situation does not resolve in approved timeframe.
Informational	The event is pertinent information but does not have a current risk element associated with it.
